

Virginia Association of Museums Conference Scholarship

The Historic House Museum Consortium of Washington, DC is offering one scholarship to attend the 2018 Virginia Association of Museums annual conference. Anyone affiliated with an HHMC site is eligible for the HHMC Scholarship. This includes full-time or part-time employees, graduate students, interns, board members, and volunteers. The scholarship will cover basic registration (at the early bird price) and travel up to \$300.

Expectations:

By sending in a completed application, applicants are indicating that they will be able to attend the conference if awarded a scholarship. If you are awarded a scholarship and do not attend the conference you will not be eligible for a scholarship in the future.

How to Apply:

Submit the completed application with one letter of recommendation and a current resumé. Applications may be submitted by e-mail or regular mail to the address below postmarked by **February 2, 2018**. Incomplete applications will not be considered. The HHMC Executive Committee will determine the scholarship recipient and notify them by February 17, 2018.
